About the DO-IT Scholars Program

The DO-IT Scholars program prepares youth with disabilities for their transition to college—which includes exploring careers, independence, self-advocacy, and leadership. DO-IT Scholars attend a multi-day Summer Study online and on the University of Washington Seattle campus, returning the following two summers to complete research and leadership training.

- **Summer Study**—Phase 1 DO-IT Scholars attend a two-week Summer Study—one week online and one week living on the University of Washington Seattle—campus returning the following two summers, as Phase 2 Scholars and Interns, for further college and career preparation and an internship.
- **Internetworking, Mentoring, and Peer Support**—DO-IT Scholars learn to use computers, software and if necessary, assistive technology, to enrich their education and to explore academic and career interests. They communicate online with mentors, DO-IT staff, and other DO-IT participants. DO-IT Scholars who do not have the necessary technology are loaned equipment and software while they participate in program activities. This may include a computer, printer, software, assistive technology, and Internet service.
- **Work-Based Learning**—DO-IT Scholars can apply to be a Summer Study leader and a participant in other work-based learning opportunities.
